

KC Condemns Anti-Semite Acts, Ask Private-School Aid

Resolutions condemning recent acts of anti-Semitism, offering "prayerful good wishes" for success of the Paris summit conference, and asking that the federal aid to education include aid to private schools were adopted last weekend by a state convention of the Knights of Columbus at Anaheim.

Howard Hood, grand knight, and Edwin C. Olsen, delegates to the convention, reported to the Los Crusados council Monday that the state council has instructed all subordinates to support efforts to eliminate "the vicious anti-Semitism acts of recent months." The convention asked that a copy of the resolution be directed to the National Conference of Christians and Jews.

Delegates to the convention petitioned the Congress of the United States to consider "... that 15% of the students attending schools in this nation are pupils in private institutions."

The Los Crusados council was represented by James McDonald, Lou Fucci, Vincent Wigel, John McVey, Joseph Platt, George Schneider, Dick Burch and Emmett Turley.

In other reports, Hood announced appointment of Laurence Sargent of Torrance to chairmanship of the fraternal committee. Sargent is director of the Nativity church men's choir, and a fourth-degree member of the Knights of Columbus. He also is advocate in the council.

The Los Crusados will participate in a quarterly communion and mass at St. Laurence Church in Hollywood Riviera at 8 a.m. Sunday, May 29. Breakfast will follow for members and their families in the council chambers, 214 Avenue I, Redondo Beach.
