This was the summary tribute paid last week to the staff of the El Camino College Warhoop, which received All-American honors from the Associated College Press for the 13th consecutive semester.

In citing the paper for its coverage, balance of news, creativeness, news writing, editorial page, features, sports coverage, front page make-up, headlines, and photography, Judge Duane Andrews also observed, "You display professional news writing capabilities."

The Warhoop was one of three junior college weeklies throughout the nation to win the coveted All-American rating. To secure the award, a total of 3400 points were necessary in the scoring con-

ducted at the University of Minnesota.

The Warhoop netted a total score of 3630, securing bonus points in balance of news coverage, front page make-up, headline writing, and photography.

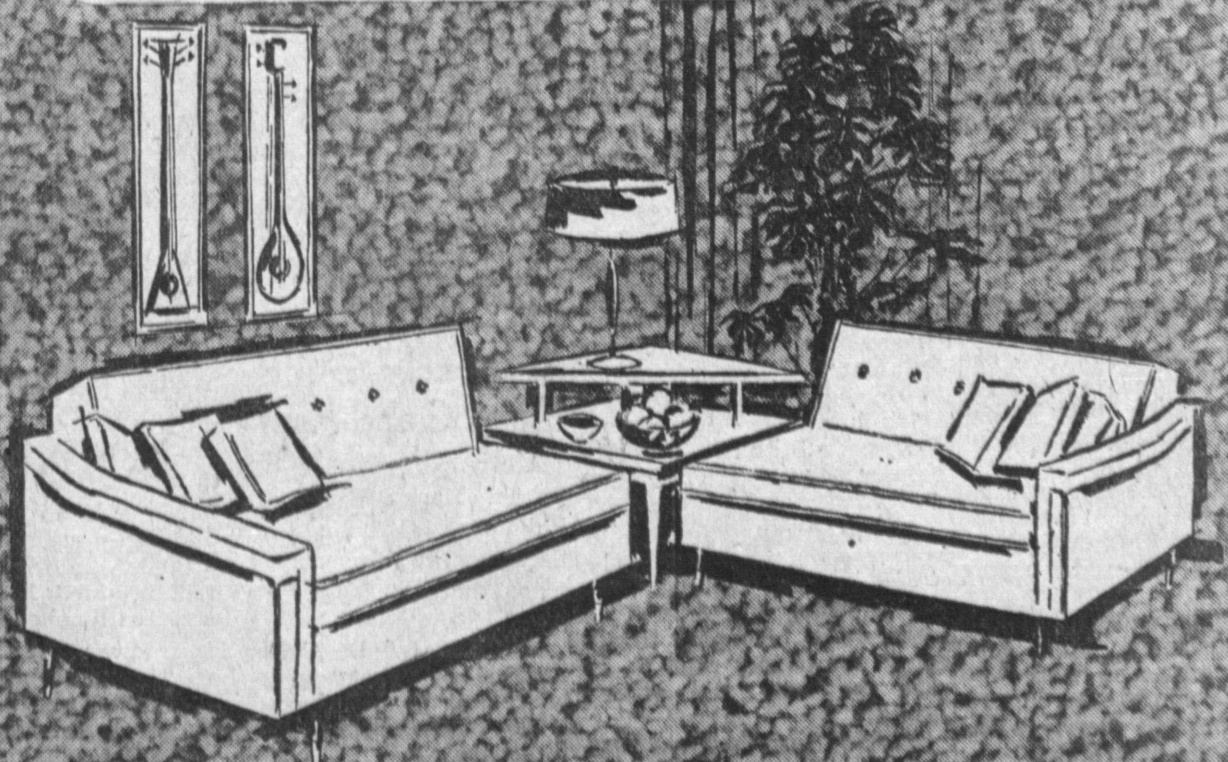
