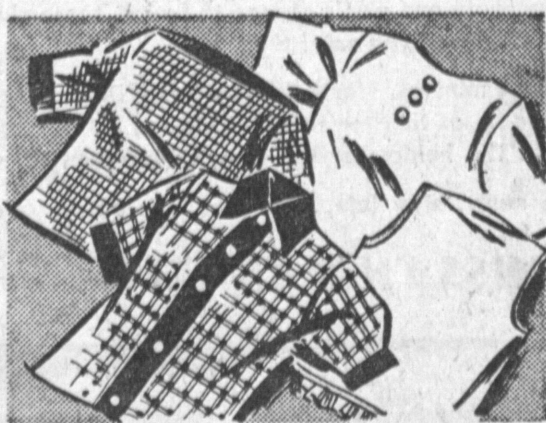

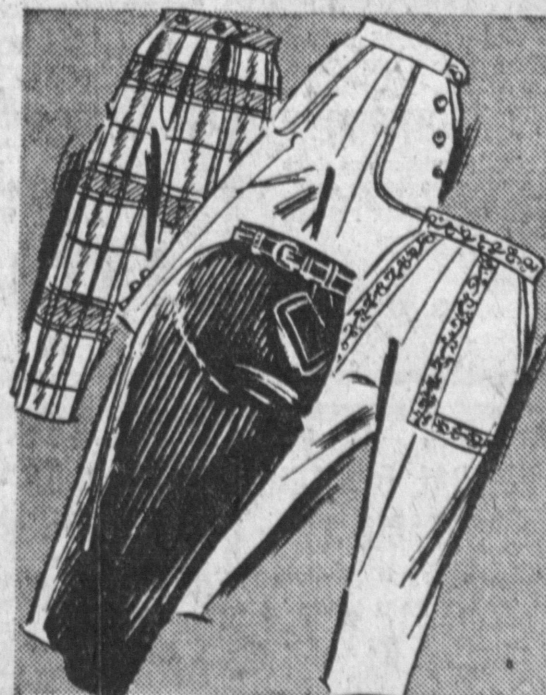

 Educator retires after 40 years

Dean Whedon Retires, Plans World Travel

Exchanging college catalogues for travel folders, and class schedules for trip itineraries, Harbor College Administrative Dean Hazel M. Whedon will complete her official duties at the college on June 30.

At that time she also will close her formal career as an educator by concluding 40 years of service to public education. A career which she began as a rural school teacher in Dickinson County Kansas, and ended as an administrator in one of the largest school systems in the nation.

Dean Whedon entered the Los Angeles City Schools in 1923 as an instructor of social studies and science at San Pedro High School. She has held administrative positions at Gardena, Manual Arts, Belmont, Jefferson, and Westchester High Schools; served as counselor with the City Schools' Advancement Service, and joined the Harbor College staff in 1951.

Mrs. Whedon's first retirement activity will combine two of her favorite leisure activities—service to community organizations and travel. On July 2 she will go by air to Detroit to represent the Harbor District Soroptimist Club at the association's national convention, and on July 13 she will board the Empress of Britain as one of 100 Soroptimist delegates from the United States to the organization's international convention in London.

After the convention she will visit Scotland briefly and then go to Rome to meet Harbor College counselor Isabel Beck and her husband, Dr. Lester Beck.

The three will proceed by air to Africa, where they will spend five weeks in Nigeria, Ghana, Liberia, Guinea, Senegal, and Morocco.

Later stops will include Madrid, Athens, Trieste, Tel Aviv, Istanbul, Florence, Oxford, and finally Amsterdam, where Mrs. Whedon will board a jet plane bound for Houston, Texas.

There she will visit her daughter, son-in-law, and three grandchildren before returning to her home in San Pedro next fall.

"My principal interest in this trip is to see people rather than places," she explained. "For example, I am interested in the present student uprisings in Istanbul and hope to be able to talk to people there and check the historical background of the situation."
