

High-School Freshmen Take Special Literature, Politics

Thirty-two Torrance High freshmen have been meeting four hours a week outside school in a special course to help them understand American literary and political works.

The students are volunteers for the class, taught by Walter Douthright, freshman problems teacher. They meet two hours on Monday afternoons and two hours on Wednesday evenings, when parents are welcome to listen.

Discussion topics have varied, including such things as Thoreau's economic theories, transcendentalism, and the shifting-crust theory of the earth.

The youngsters went to hear Eleanor Roosevelt discuss "Is the United States Facing Up to World Leadership?" recently and attended "The World of Carl Sandburg" with Bette Davis.

Note-taking and report-writing have been emphasized to develop critical thinking. Special reports have been given on such topics as political theories of government, current social problems, and the causes of World War III.

Parents attend many of the Wednesday evening sessions, and one, Enola Burdick, has taken shorthand notes of the discussions and

assignments. She has transcribed them for future use.

Principal Carl R. Ahee termed the study group "a welcome addition to the curriculum and indicated that such a group may be continued in the future. Despite the 200 extra hours involved, grade-point averages of participating students did not suffer, he said.
