'Smokey the Bear' Meets 'Bubbles the Whale'

Two of the nation's most beloved members of the Animal Kingdom, one symbolic of forest fire prevention, the other symbolic of water, met today for the first time on the latter's home base, Marineland of the Pacific.

"Smokey Bear," mascot of the U.S. Forest Service, Association of California State Foresters and Advertising Council and known by millions as the bear who reminds campers to stamp out their cigarettes and camp fires before leaving mountain areas, journeyed to Marineland at the invitation of William F. Monahan, vice-president and general manager of the oceanarium, to meet "Bubbles," the 1700-pound black pilot whale star of the show. Although it was pointed out that the

chances were extremely remote that "Bubbles" would ever leave a live cigarette or camp fire burning, nevertheless "Smokey Bear" said that safety precautions were for everyone and not just a few.

After visiting at "Bubbles" tank, "Smokey Bear" went to the porpoise tank and gave "Zippy," the world's smartest porpoise, a junior Forest Ranger badge for extinguishing a small fire on a ramp by means of splashing water on the blaze with his bobbing head.

With millions of expected tourists due into vacation camps and resorts during the summer months, the forest agencies are working around the clock with "Smokey" in hopes of making campers aware of the terrible damage one cigarette or camp fire can inflict on dry mountain areas.

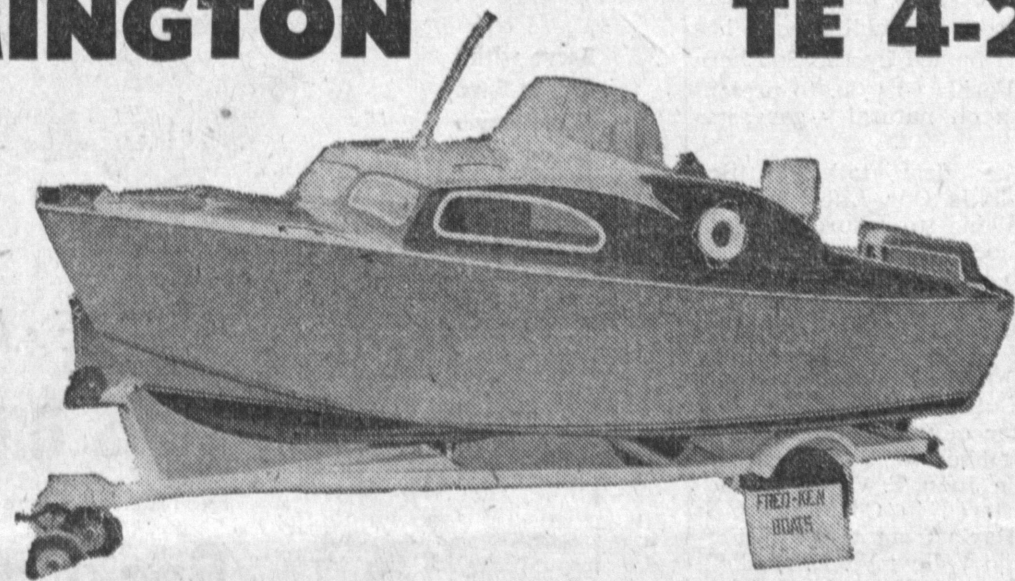
