## Housewife Tells Experiences on Jury Duty

lasted nine days.  
Jury duty lasts 30 or 20 days in the jury box, which ever comes first. Payments is \$5 a day and 15 cents a mile one way.

Torrance is approximately 22 miles.

This seems a small payment but surprisingly enough covered baby-sitting expenses for my two children and my car expenses.

There is a free parking lot for jurors and a cafeteria in the courthouse where a variety of dishes are served at a nominal cost.

When serving as a juror, one can expect to find two kinds of cases, civil and criminal.

Civil cases are conducted in the new courthouse and usually involve accident, condemnation, or damage suits.

In these cases nine out of 12 jurors must agree on a verdict.

Criminal cases are conducted in the Hall of Justice or the Hall of Records.

On a criminal case all 12 jurors must agree on a verdict. If you are deliberating and have not reached a decision, you can expect to be locked up for the night.

I had often heard this joked about, but never expected to experience it. I did.

Our jury had not reached a decision by 4:30 p.m. and we were transported by police bus to the Alexandria Hotel, where we were assigned two to a room and instructed not to discuss the case among ourselves.

We returned to the courtroom the next day and reached a decision. Judge Nye was quite happy as it is a small inconvenience to the court for a jury to be locked up. But a worthwhile one, when the jury returns with a fresh mind and comes to a just and true verdict.

All in all I can say that this was one of the most rewarding and unforgettable experiences I have ever encountered.

I met many wonderful people and learned a great deal about the processes of law.

Few homemakers serve, because of the inconvenience to their family. I had these reasons too, but my family lived through the inconveniences, the drive on the freeway was not bad, and the knowledge I gained was much more worthwhile than the inconvenience it caused.

Judge Hardy, a very wonderful judge and person, took the time to explain some of the fine points of law to me and to say a statement I feel is worth quoting.

"It is a great American heritage, the jury system and it can only exist as long as people are willingly serving as jurors."
