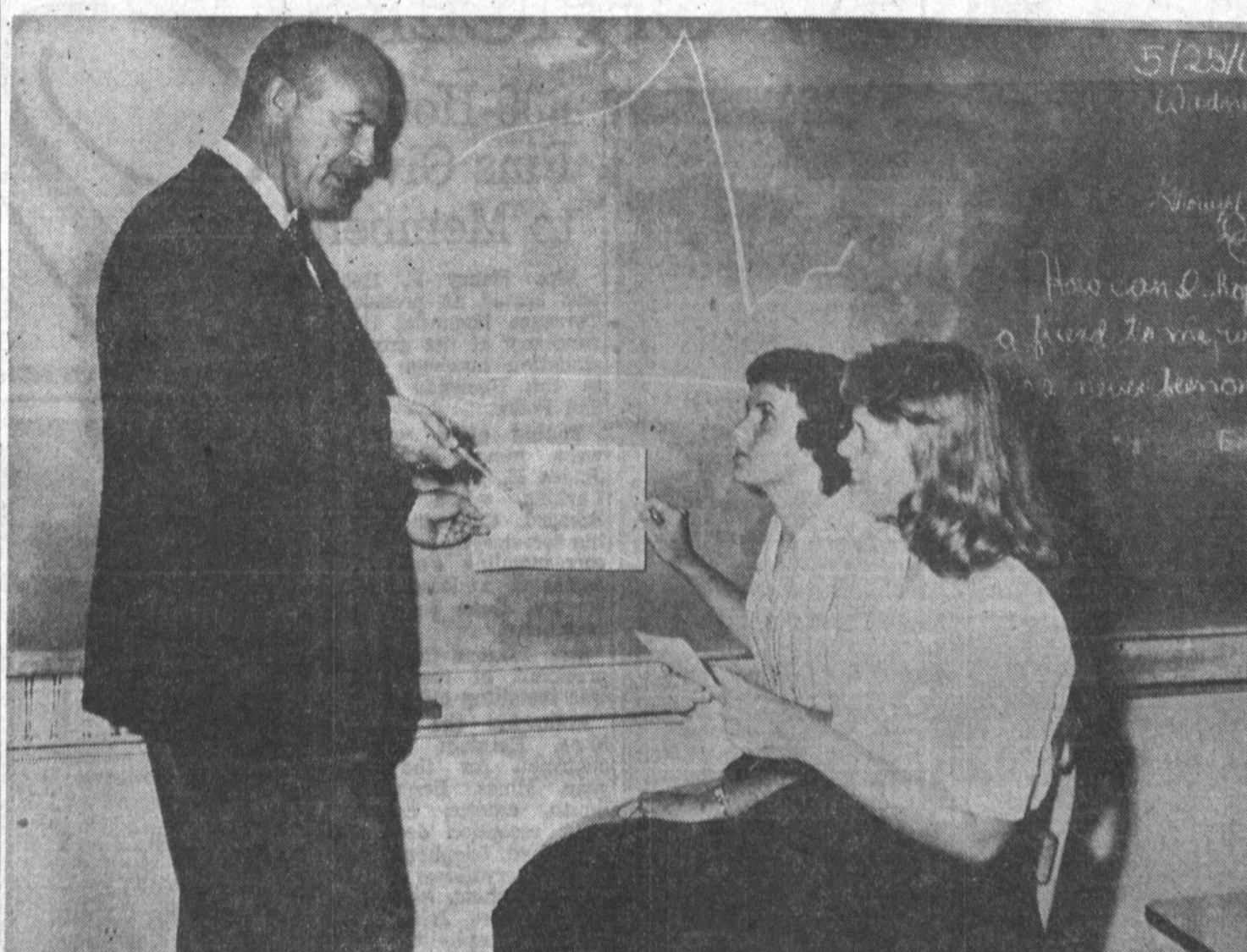

Pacific Smelting Scholarship Goes to Larry Staat for '60

M. D. Schwartz, president of the Pacific Smelting Co., has announced that Larry Arnold Staat, 17-year-old graduating senior from North High School, has been awarded the 1960 Pacific Smelting Foundation educational scholarship.

This will be the fourth year a scholarship has been awarded a high school senior in the Torrance system.

The Pacific Smelting Foundation educational scholarship is exclusively for graduating seniors in the Torrance school system who desire to obtain a mathematics, scientific, or engineering degree in an accredited university.

The recipient of this scholarship is chosen on the basis of scholastic record, character, citizenship, leadership, aptitude, and general educational outlook.

Applicants present a writ-

ten report on their qualifications and are given a personal interview.

This year applications were received from North High, South High, and Torrance high schools, all of the Torrance Unified School District.

The scholarship will provide Larry \$500 a year for five years to assist him in his college expenses. He will enroll at UCLA and major in mathematics.

Winners of this scholarship in prior years were: 1957, Laurence L. George, who will soon be a senior at UCLA majoring in engineering; 1958, Walter A. Sapp, currently attending University of California at Berkeley and a mathematics major; 1959, Howard A. Borer, also attending Berkeley with a major in mathematics.

Arnold and Kathryn Staat, who reside at 17003 Ardath,

are parents of Larry. He has two brothers, Bill, 20, Stephen, 9, and one sister, Patricia, 12.

Larry has a grade-point average of 4, which means straight A through his entire high-school career. He was No. 1 in class standing of 343 students. He has been active in all phases of school activities.
