Capacity Crowds See Wilder Brothers at Marineland

18% Drop in Prices at Eatery

Cutback of food prices to pre-inflation levels at the McDonald's drive-in at 17305 Crenshaw in Torrance was announced by Don Daley, operator of the restaurant.

Price cuts averaging 18% in all of the food items sold at the drive-in will be initiated this weekend (June 23 to 26) in an anti-inflation move designed to return to prices of a decade ago.

Hamburgers are being reduced from 18 to 15 cents, French fries from 12 to 10 cents and milkshakes from 24 to 20 cents as a phase of the anti-inflation campaign by the McDonald's drive-in, which is part of a national chain of 175 units in 29 states.

The first McDonald's drive-in was opened in San Bernardino in 1948 by Dick and Mac McDonald and the prices being posted at the Torrance unit of McDonald's beginning this weekend are the same prices charged 12 years ago, according to the McDonald brothers, who still operate the San Bernardino drive-in.

McDonald's announced the anti-inflation move in its food prices with an open letter to patrons in communities surrounding its location. "We are convinced that inflation is one of the greatest enemies we face in America today and we want to do our part in battling steadily climbing prices," declared Dick McDonald. "The McDonald's chain is based on efficiency and sales volume which will keep prices down. Our price cuts in the Torrance unit are a reflection of our determination to maintain the same prices we charged for hamburgers and milkshakes 12 years ago, although the general cost of living has increased more than 20% in the past decade.

"Even if inflation goes on, we will fight it to the last ditch and not yield to the easy temptation of raising prices. Rather we will seek ways of being more efficient and selling more. We hope to be selling hamburgers in 1975 for 15 cents just as we do now and maintain the same high standards of quality which we have during these years of slow but certain upward price trends," said McDonald.
