

Realtor Disperses Term Mystery

"A brief study of the few unfamiliar words heard most frequently during real estate transactions will quickly dispel any mystery that might seem to surround a home purchase," declared Lee R. Dawson, president of the Torrance-Lomita Board of Realtors, recently. The board is affiliated with the National Association of Real Estate Boards.

"When you plan to join the 60% of families who own homes, you will probably encounter a few puzzling terms concerning real estate, just as you would in any specialized field," Dawson added. "However, these need not be confusing," he said, defining a few of the more common expressions:

TRUST-DEED—A conveyance of real property given as security for the payment of a debt or the fulfillment of some obligation.

EQUITY—The interest or value which an owner has in real estate over and above the mortgage indebtedness against it.

AMORTIZATION—The process of extinguishing a debt by equal payments at regular intervals over a specific period of time.

APPRAISAL—An estimate of quantity, quality, or value. The process through which conclusions of property value or property facts are obtained; also the report setting forth the estimate and conclusions.

CONTRACT FOR SALE—A written agreement whereby the purchaser agrees to buy certain real estate and the seller agrees to sell upon terms and conditions set forth therein.

EXCLUSIVE LISTING—A contract to sell property as an agent, according to the

There is a saying "Our country is the land of opportunity," if all parents of mentally handicapped children bond together we can prove this old saying to be true.

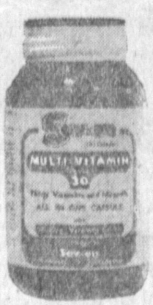
