

Refusing to pay his rub-bish collection bill to Torrance, which amounted to \$18, Leonard C. Young, 4913 Reese Road, was taken to court and won his case against the city.

Young interpreted the assessment ordinance as payable for schools, lights, curbs, etc., but he stated, "I've lived here since 1936, having trash pick-up service since then, and haven't been asked to pay until two and a half years ago.'

In court, Judge Donald Armstrong ruled that all payment before Jan. 1, 1960, before the ordinance was effective, was given as a voluntary donation, however, he charged Young \$6 for collection fees since that ordinance
