## Major Stakes at Hollypark Over Holiday

Inglewood Handicap winner Bagdad, the great filly Silver Spoon and such two-year-old stars as King Kameha, Olden Times and Mr. America will be featured during an outstanding holiday week-end of racing at Hollywood Park.

Three major stakes will be run at Hollypark over the week-end, starting Friday (July 1) with the \$20,000 added Haggin Stakes for two-year-old colts and geldings at five furlongs.

With previous stakes winners Pappa's All, Dance Lesson and Wire Us barred by the conditions, the nominees are topped by Fair Oaks stable's King Kameha, Rex Ellsworth's Olden Times and Verne Winchell Jr.'s, Mr. America.

King Kameha finished second to Papa's All in the latter's two stakes wins, and then was runner up to Wire Us in Hollywood Park's Westchester Stakes. Olden Times has been unbeaten in two tries, and Mr. America, a strapping son of Free America, was an impressive winner in his first start in 57-4/5.

The Hollywood Park feature on Saturday will be the \$35,000 added Vanity Handicap for three-year-old and up fillies and mares. At a mile and one-eighth this race annually determines the distaff championship of the meeting. Last year it went to Bug Brush, a stablemate of Silver Spoon, who was voted the best three-year-old filly of the season.

Silver Spoon captured Hollywood's recent Milady Handicap by nearly three lengths from Honeys Gem, and the brilliant Citation filly probably will be heavily favored against Honeys Gem, La Plume and others of her sex in the Vanity.

The \$50,000 added American Handicap at a mile and one-eighth on Monday, July 4, will draw Bagdad, Sea Orbit, Fleet Nasrullah, Prize Host, Eddie Schmidt, Sea-

neen, Twenty-one Guns and others to the starting line in the final major stepping leading up to the \$162,100 Hollywood Gold Cup July 16.

Bagdad has drilled impressively since his three-quarter-length triumph over the tremendously improved Sea Orbit in the Inglewood Handicap, and is expected to be the pre-race favorite for the American, which last year drew a holiday crowd of 49,448.

Following its special Monday program on the Fourth of July, Hollywood Park will be dark Tuesday.
