Post-Divorce Counsel Planned at Institute

No city in the United States has as large a population of divorced persons as has Los Angeles, according to Dr. Paul Popenoe, president of the American Institute of Family Relations in Los Angeles.

"For every 100 marriage licenses issued last year in Los Angeles County there were 39 actions filed for divorce or separate maintenance," he stated.

To give practical aid to men and women who want to make a satisfactory readjustment after divorce, the American Institute of Family Relations is offering a series of five informal talks and discussions under the general title of New Horizons After Divorce.

Meeting will be held at the Institute's headquarters, 5387

Sunset Blvd., Monday evenings from 7:30 to 9, from July 11 through Aug. 8.

At the first session, Dr. Donald P. Wilson, psychologist, will talk on "Reorganizing Your Emotional Life."

He will discuss techniques for getting rid of feelings of inferiority, guilt, resentment, and depression by acquiring a new perspective.

Ensuing programs will deal with problems such as living without a mate, being both father and mother to one's children, understanding the peculiarities of the opposite sex, and creating a new social life.


