

Health Officer Reports on Polio

"0-yes-0" was the report of the district health officer, B. A. Kogan, M.D., who reported that there have been no polio cases in Torrance yet this year. "This is heart warming news," he mentioned, after stating that in 1955, the city suffered from 33 cases of the dread disease. Numbers of cases have regularly decreased since that time, with 11 cases in 1956, seven in 1958, and five in 1959. The doctor continued that the decreasing size of the victim reports shouldn't be allowed to give the people a false sense of security. He stated that the fact that

we have no cases should prove the value of the vaccine and encourage people to get the shots.

The doctor compared the polio epidemic with the threats of small pox which panicked the nation before a vaccine was found to control it. He said that even though this disease is almost unheard of now, that is no reason to ban the cure.

In closing, Dr. Kogan said, "Vaccination is the best investment you can make, so for heaven's sake, get the shots for you and your family."

College Counselors Begin Meetings

Counseling, testing and registration appointments for those wishing to attend El Camino College full-time during the fall semester will be available at the college counseling office from July 11 to Sept. 2.

Hours will be Monday through Thursday, 9 a.m. to 7 p.m.; Fridays, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., from July 11 to Aug. 3. From Aug. 4 to Sept. 2, hours will be 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Those who plan to attend part-time during the fall will be able to pick up permits to register beginning July 18 in the registration office on campus. Hours will be 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., Monday through Thursday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Fridays.

Placement tests, to be given in English, mathematics, chemistry and swimming, must be completed no less than five days before registration. Leo M. Christian, assistant director of registration, has announced. In addition, those wishing to complete a program leading to transfer to a four-year institution must take the College Ability Test prior to registration.

Continuing students who filed priority registration cards during the spring semester will be notified by mail of registration appointment time.

School's out! For the next three months children will be playing on the sidewalks, and some of them will unexpectedly dart out into the roadways. This was the reminder to motorists issued today by Deputy Chief H. W. Sullivan, commander of the L.A.P.D. Traffic Bureau.

During the school year, drivers were alerted to the presence of children in the vicinity of schools by yellow crosswalks. Now children may be anywhere, at any hour of the day or evening, Chief Sullivan pointed out.

"The moral is clear," he said. "We must protect the children against the consequences of their own impulsiveness. In residential areas a driver must double his vigilance, proceed cautiously and actually expect some children to run in front of his car."

Torrance Graduate Studies Produce at Kellogg Campus

Torrance High graduate, Phillip Arthur Crosby, has been accepted as a freshman crop production major at the Kellogg campus of California State Polytechnic College, school officials have reported.

Crosby graduated this spring, and he will enter Cal Poly for the fall quarter beginning Sept. 19. His first week will consist of orientation activities, tests, physical examination, and registration. More than 2,000 students are expected to enroll in the college's divisions of Agriculture, Engineering, Arts and Sciences, and Business, an increase of approximately 30% over the spring quarter enrollment of 1,600.
