

It is hoped that through tight organization the new use can be enjoyed without ruining the admittedly excellent fishing the lake provides. Plans call for marker buoys to delineate a speed boat area for fast craft not pulling skiers, a special ski zone where only boats pulling skiers may operate, and "buffer zone" around the lake approximately 150 feet wide where a 5 M.P.H. speed timit will be in effect.
