Although the seven Councilmen of Torrance get pai only \$100 a month for their efforts, the City Manager's monthly stipend is \$1760. The figure includes the recent wage increase authorized and approved by the City Coun-

The above salary is below that paid City Manager's in cities comparable in size and population to Torrance. A recent survey of the municipalities of Burbank, Downey, Glendale, Pasadena, and Santa Monica showed an average maximum salary paid to City Managers of \$1943 monthly.

Voted in by People

Prior to 1948, Torrance had no City Manager. During this election year the people voted in a city Manager to take over duties formally held, in part, by the City Clerk. Because of a state law, he could not take office until the California State Legislature ratified the mandate of the people of the city of Torrance. It wasn't until January of 1949 that this was done and the present City Manager sworn in. All the departments of the city, except the City Attor-

ney, come under the jurisdiction of the City Manager. The former is responsible directly to the City Council. That is why both of them attend every Council meeting. It is the duty of the City Manager to recommend to

the Council: legislation, financial programs, capital improvements, policies; and employment. One of the chief functions of the City Manager is to

prepare a yearly budget to the Council for approval. He then expends funds as authorized by the ruling body. The City Manager's office is an appointed one, not elected. He can be dismissed by a majority vote of the Coun-
