

### Firm Receives Army Contract

Harvey Aluminum of Torrance received a \$250,000 contract for development and fabrication of projectile components recently from the U.S. Army Ordnance District of Los Angeles.

Also, the Corporation received a \$60,249 contract for catapult assemblies and a \$29,989 award for production engineering services.

These Army Ordnance contracts are part of the over \$5,000,000 in contracts awarded to firms throughout the nation.

### Board Approves Salary Increase for Instructors

Salary increases averaging 4 1/2 per cent for 20,000 Los Angeles City School teachers were approved by the Board of Education last week upon recommendation of Superintendent Ellis A. Jarvis. Final action on increases for 7000 non-teaching personnel has been deferred until 2 p.m. today.

To finance all salary increases will require approximately \$9,000,000, most of which already has been put into a reserve. The remainder will be put into the salary account in the final budget.

Meanwhile, the board of education adopted the next to the last, or publication, budget, calling for an operating expenditure during 1960-61 of \$253,160,459. This is \$341,446 more than the tentative budget approved June 23. Including all expenditures, such as bond sinking funds, next year's estimated tax rate will be \$3.63 per \$100 of assessed valuation, or approximately \$0.14 higher than 1959-60.

### Doubleheader Set at Gardena Track

Sunday will be a doubleheader day at the Gardena Stadium, when the new Claiming Stock Cars take to the track in a ten event racing program in the afternoon followed in the evening by the gigantic 100 car Destruction Derby.

Heading the list of entries for the stock car races will be four top pilots in Art Atkinson, Termit Snyder, Chuck Townsen, and Bruce Worrell. Over 40 cars are expected to be on hand for the first race at 2:30 p.m. Admission for adults is \$1.50 with kids free.

Sunday evening the famous Destruction Derby takes to the track in an eight event show featuring the wrecking of over 100 automobiles. Leading fender-bender will be Woody Pridgett of Gardena the leading Negro driver at the track, who captured last week's main event.

His top competition will come from last week's second and third place finishers, Bob Goddard, Malibu and Gene Millard, Lynwood. Both drivers pilot Chevrolet's and are running in the top ten in championship points.

Also carded on the program are several team races, headed up by the all Negro team led by Pridgett against the All-Star team captained by Howard Walton. The first event will begin at 8 p.m. Admission for adults is \$1.75 with juniors \$1 and kids under eight free.
