



### Police Arraign Murder Suspect

Arrested and arraigned, Russell Richard Caccamese of Gardena will be brought to the South Bay Municipal court for his preliminary hearing July 29-at 10:30 a.m. for suspicion of murder.

The suspect is accused with the murder of Madeleine May Acevedo, 23, of Torrance who was shot in the head at her home.

The police claim that Caccamese, 34, shot the woman, then shot himself in the arm to turn suspicion away from himself.

Police Chief Ray Tracey indicated that information received from an autopsy as well as from witnesses indicated that the woman did not shoot Caccamese then commit suicide.
