

The early deer season opens Aug. 6, and closes Sept 25. This is the early season end is for the costal counties including Orange, Los Angeles, part of Kern, Ventura, Santa Barbara, etc. If you want a complete list stop in at Sportsville U.S.A. and get one free. The limit in this season is 2 bucks. Don't wait till the last minute for hunting licenses or deer tags as the stores always seem to run short. Also member that any youngster under 16 must have a hunting license and unless they have gone thru the hunter training course or had a license last year, a license agent cannot issue them a license. This course takes several weeks so enroll the youngsters now. Another good point is that due to the extreme fire hazard almost every hunting area is closed to open fires so check with Fish and Game early as to regulations in the area that you intend to hunt.

The water along the Redondo coast has dirtied so the leal fishing will probably be off for a few days. Make plans to fish the Islands or Horseshoe Kelp. Lake Crowley closes this weekend. Lots of Marlin showing up in local waters with several hooked up but none landed as of now. The Albacore are still way out and the local landings are running 2 day trips which gives the skippers a chance to look around and locate the schools which are moving as much as 20 miles in a single night. Lots of nice Calicos were being caught at the Long Beach Breakwaters until the water got dirty so the fish moved out in clear water.
