

Officer Offers Drivers Advice on Crosswalks

If you think the pedestrian marked crosswalk. This is the advice offered to drivers today by Deputy Chief H. W. Sullivan, commander, LAPD Traffic Bureau.

A crosswalk does not have to be marked with painted lines, Chief Sullivan emphasized. Wherever a street intersects another at a right angle, an imaginary extension of the sidewalk boundaries constitutes a legal crosswalk.

It may be marked or unmarked; thousands of crosswalks in Los Angeles are not defined by painted lines.

"Unmarked crosswalks at offset intersections confuse some drivers because there are often four legal crosswalks intersecting the main street, and only one or two may be painted," he said.

T-intersections, where an inconspicuous street dead-ends into a major thoroughfare, also cause problems because the motorist may be unaware of the two legal crosswalks thus created.

"A driver must yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian in a marked or unmarked crosswalk if there is danger of conflict between the vehicle and the pedestrian," he added.

"In addition to this," Chief Sullivan said, "good driving principles require that a motorist be alert for the presence of pedestrians wherever they may be encountered and allow them to reach a place of safety."

This was recognized by the legislature when it passed the law which says:

"(a) Every pedestrian crossing a roadway at any point other than within a marked crosswalk or within an unmarked crosswalk at an intersection shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles upon the roadway.

"(b) The provisions of this section shall not relieve the driver of a vehicle from the duty of exercise due care for the safety of any pedestrian upon a roadway." (California Vehicle Code, Section 21954).

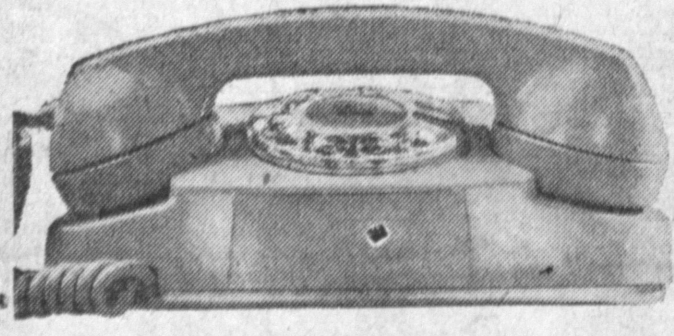

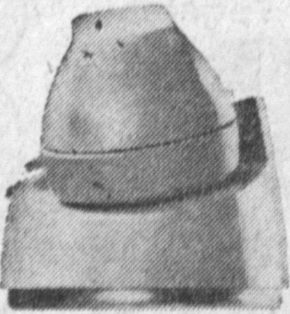

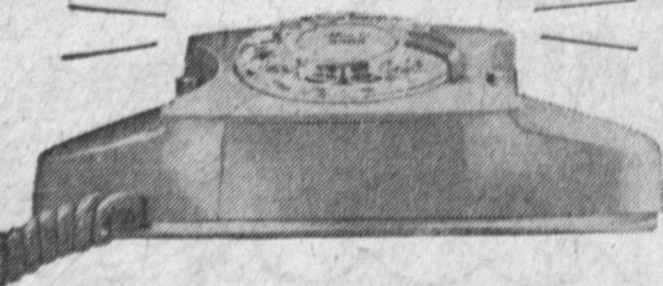

Large Street Construction Slated Here

A far-reaching street construction project in the Shoe-string Strip adjoining Torrance, one of the largest jobs of its kind in recent years, will get underway soon under a contract awarded today by the Board of Public Works.

The work entails opening, paving and widening other streets in the area east of Western Ave. and south of 203rd St., the construction of appurtenant facilities, and the installation of storm drains and sewers.

The Board let a \$188,199.66 contract to the Griffith Company, lowest of seven bidders, whose offer was 18.7 per cent under the city's estimate of \$231,585.59.

Under the contract, the work must be completed in 180 days.

The improvement is an Assessment Act project financed by the benefiting property owners, but District Councilman John S. Gibson Jr., obtained a contribution of \$44,813.75 from the city's Traffic Safety, Permanent Improvement and General Funds to help defray the cost of the work.

Streets to be improved by widening, resurfacing, curbs, gutters and sidewalks are in the area bounded by 203rd St. on the north, Torrance Blvd. on the south, Denker Ave. on the east and Western Ave. on the west.

Streets marked for improvement include Harvard Blvd., Denker Ave., 205th St., 206th St., 207th St., 209th St., and Torrance Blvd.

Storm drain facilities will be installed to drain flood waters near the intersection of Western Ave. and Torrance Ave., and the intersection of 204th and 205th Sts. with Denker Ave.

Plans also provide for the installation of mainline sewers in 206th St. east of Western Ave. and in Torrance Blvd. between 208th and 209th Sts., and the relocation of a traffic signal at Torrance Blvd. and Western Ave., Councilman Gibson said.

According to the Citizens Public Expenditure Survey, Inc., interests on the public debt runs to \$18,073.33 a minute, or \$1,084,400 an hour.
