

# Large Street Construction **Slated Here**

A far-reaching street construction project in the Shoestring Strip adjoining Torrance, one of the largest jobs of its kind in recent years, will get underway soon under a contract awarded today by the Board of Public

The work entails opening paving and widening other streets in the area east of Western Ave. and south of 203rd St., the construction of appurtenant facilities, and the installation of storm drains and sewers.

The Board let a \$188,199.66 contract to the Griffith Company, lowest of seven bidders, whose offer was 18.7 per cent under the city's estimate of \$231,585.59.

Under the contract, the work must be completed in 180 days.

The improvement is an Assessment Act project financed by the benefiting property owners, but District Councilman John S. Gibson Jr., ob tained a contribution of \$44, 813.75 from the city's Traffic Safety, Permanent Improvement and General Funds to help defray the cost of the work.

Streets to be improved by widening, resurfacing, curbs gutters and sidewalks are in the area bounded by 203rd St. on the north, Torrance Blvd. on the south, Denker Ave. on the east and Western Ave. on the west.

Streets marked for improvement include Harvard Blvd., Denker Ave., 205th St., 206th St., 207th St., 209th St., and Torrance Blvd.

Storm drain facilities will be installed to drain flood waters near the intersection of Western Ave. and Torrance Ave., and the intersection of 204th and 205th Sts. with

Denker Ave. Plans also provide for the installation of mainline sewers in 206th St. east of Western Ave. and in Torrance Blvd, between 208th and 209th Sts., and the relocation of a traffic signal at Torrance Blvd, and Western Ave., Councilman Gibson
