



THE NAVY'S NEW HYDROSKIMMER takes a trial run in the Pentagon lagoon to celebrate the Bureau of Ships' 20th anniversary. Powered by three 80-hp Mercury outboard motors, the unique craft rides on a cushion of air contained within fins on each side and "walls" of water at the forward and after ends. The center outboard motor drives a large fan

which provides the cushion of compressed air, while the other two motors pump water for the water-walls and drive propellers to provide forward motion. The walls of water are scooped from the sea and pumped down with force from nozzle bars on the underside of the hull.

U. S. Spikers Tune-up

The powerful United States Olympic track and field team, headed by a hatful of world and Olympic record holders, stages a competitive dress rehearsal for Rome tomorrow night at Long Beach Memorial Stadium, Lakewood and Carson.

First event, hammer throw, is at 6:30 p.m. and first running event, the crowd pleasing 400-meter relay featuring two teams of Olympic swiftness, is at 7:45 p.m. The meet, the Long Beach Pre-Olympics, is sponsored by the Long Beach Century Club with net proceeds to the Olympic Fund.

Cynsure of attraction on the field will be fantastic John Thomas of Boston University, holder of the world high jump record of 7-3 3/4 and who has cleared 7 ft. or better in all 30 appearances indoors and out this year. Thomas starts going skyward at 8:30 p.m.

There are other highlights galore including Glenn Davis, holder of the world 400-meter hurdle record of 49.2, seeking a double in the grueling stick race and the 400 meter dash; resumption of the shot put four-way among Dallas Long, Parry O'Brien, Dave Davis and Bill Nieder; appearance of Australia's Al Lawrence in the 10,000 meter run against Maxie Truex, and a mile relay with the Olympians seeking to better the world 3:07.3 record, set by the 1956 team.

The Long Beach stadium track has been rebuilt for the occasion and has been declared "fast" in practice. Good reserved seats, priced at \$2 and \$3, remain. The stadium seats 12,500.

14 SHRINE GRIDDERS USC-BOUND

Apparently the recent appointment of John McKay as the new USC head football coach met with enthusiastic endorsement of many of California's top graduating football seniors.

At least such might be deduced from the 14 North and South team players in the Shrine North-South Football Classic, Aug. 5, at the Coliseum, who have disclosed their intention to become Trojans.

Five South gridders hope to enter USC immediately and three more plan to qualify through junior college. From the North, three direct and three via jaycees swells the total well beyond the nine for runner-up Oregon State and seven for UCLA.

Oregon State, however, gets three right off the South roster and four out of the North camp immediately, with only two planning to go to a J.C. UCLA plucks only one direct—North tackle Kent Francisco—and four South and two North through junior college. Fourth with six is California, while Oregon and Stanford have five each.

Ten players from both North and South are decided on a definite four-year school to attend, while three more North and five South hope to enter a four-year university in the fall, but are still undecided.
