Youths Complete Algebra During Summer Session

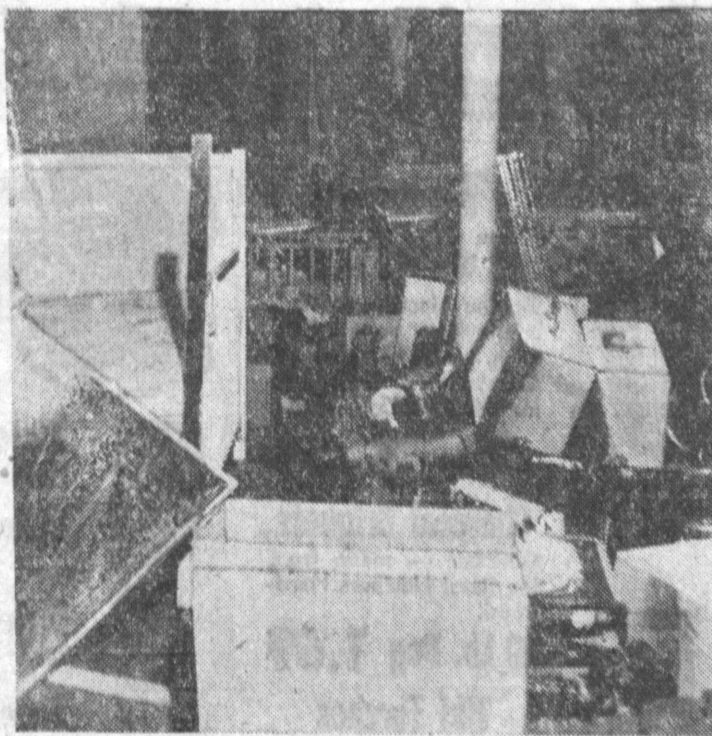
Completing a year's work in six weeks, 13 students at South High School completed algebra I during summer sessions this year, according to John Lucas, principal.

The accelerated course included four-hour sessions each morning under the instruction Allen Moore, veteran math and science teacher. Students who took part in the sessions were specially recommended by their eighth grade teacher. All will enter the ninth grade this fall.

As a result of their work, 10 of the students will enter algebra II classes this fall, while three will go into geometry.

Homework was heavy during the summer sessions, with students delving into various complex mathematical concepts. Moore taught the students how to multiply large numbers in their heads, making a game of "mental arithmetic."

Torrance Officers Go All Out in Fire Prevention

Torrance police and fire departments joined the California Highway Patrol this week in a concerted effort calling community attention to halt mounting fires caused by motorists tossing lighted cigarettes or matches out of their automobiles.

Officers of the Torrance Police, as well as Highway Patrolmen are instructed to cite anyone observed throwing any lighted substance on any road or highway outside of a business or residential district.

Torrance Fire Department Chief Jay Bennett, who has been with the department for 33 years and chief for the past decade, announced "Tor-

rance has been fortunate in fire suppression despite the tremendous population growth."

The Torrance fire department operates with a 90 man staff, with 74 men actually assigned to fire suppression, "despite the fact that the city has doubled in size in the past five years," Chief Bennett stated.

Four stations scattered throughout the area comprise the Torrance Fire Department. These include stations at Carson and Crenshaw Blvd., 242 and Neece, which will be relocated to a Torrance Airport site early next year, 174 and Yukon, and Calle Mayor and Pacific Coast Highway.
