County you run into huge expanses of highway leading to small insignificant towns with scarely a baseball traveling fan. In New York, the suburbs are loaded with sports fans within easy commuting distance. For 25 or 30 cents you can ride rapid transit to a game in the big city, some 50 miles away, but just try and do it for a like amount and speed from say Ventura or Santa Ana. Impossible, of course.

### No Extra Fans Around

It is safe, therefore to assume that the fans that come to see the Dodgers are the same ones that would come see an American League team here. At the present rate of admissions at the Coliseum it would mean that O'Malley would only get a 1,200,000 gate instead of the 2 million plus he


In a few years there will be extra fans around because of the way booming Los Angeles County is growing.




