### Auxiliary Holds Writing Contest

Opening of the 26th annual National High School Writing Contest was announced recently by the Ladies Auxiliary to the Veterans of Foreign Wars. The topic will be "Law and the Free Citizen."

Students in all public, private and parochial high schools are eligible to enter the contest. National prizes are: First, \$1,000 cash; second \$500; third \$250; fourth, \$100; and 20 other cash awards for honorable mention. State and local contest winners receive additional Auxiliary awards which vary with the community.

The writing contest was begun by the auxiliary in 1935 to encourage young people to think and write on patriotic subjects. During the last school year more than 30,000 students from all 50 states entered the national contest. Leo Hoegh, director of the Office of Civil and Defense Mobilization, served as chairman of the national judges.

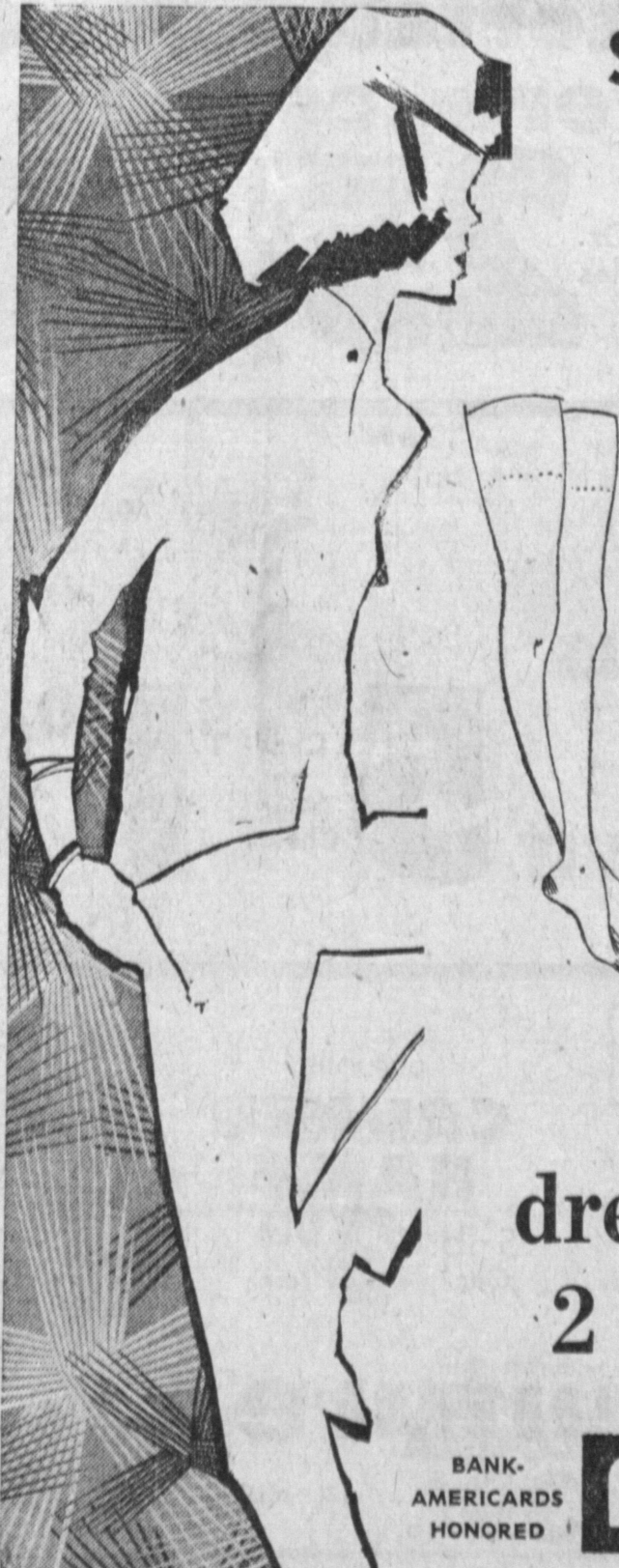
