 Continuing its performanc-  
 es each week night through  
 Saturday, Sept. 3, the excit-  
 ing Royal Danish Ballet,  
 headed by 16 European dance  
 stars, completes the notable  
 Ballet Festival of Two Con-  
 tients at the Greek Theater.  
 Its second program,  
 Wednesday through Satur-  
 day, Aug. 24-27, brings Rol-  
 and Petit's choreographic  
 presentation of "Carmen," to  
 the Bizet music, Balanchine's  
 depiction of the legend of  
 "Apollo," to stimulative Stra-  
 vinsky music, and the last  
 act of "Napoli," exactly as  
 choreographed by the famed  
 August Bournoville in 1842,  
 expressly for the Royal Dan-  
 ish Ballet.  
 The final week brings the  
 oldest of all ballets, "The  
 Whims of Cupid," just as it  
 was performed by the Danes  
 in 1786, with every detail of  
 Vicenzo Galeotti's choreogra-  
 phy.  
 In contrast is the American  
 premiere of Birgit Cullberg's  
 dramatic concept of a Lapp  
 legend, "The Moon Reindeer."  
 A merry climax is provided  
 by the familiar "Graduation  
 Ball," with the "different"  
 touches that David Lichine  
 originally devised for the  
 Royal Danish Ballet.  
 Johnny Mathis, starring in  
 his own sensational show,  
 ends the Greek Theater ses-  
 sion, Monday through Sunday  
 nights, Sept. 5-11.
