Local College Offers Night Music Class During Fall

Band and college choir evening classes will be offered by Harbor College during the fall semester, Kenneth R. Williams, assistant dean of extended day, said today.

Band is scheduled for Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m. It is possible to enroll for either one or both nights, depending upon whether the student wishes to earn one or two units upon completion of the course.

The instructor will be Mrs. Gloria Chadwick, who has had many years of experience in band work in the Harbor area and at USC. She plans to form a pep band from the evening classes to play at college and community events.

College choir will meet Wednesdays from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m. under the direction of Kathryn H. Clauset of the LAHC faculty. The class will emphasize choral blend, diction, tone quality, and intonation, and will rehearse and prepare choral literature for public presentation. Two other classes in college choir will be offered by the day college.

Mrs. Clauset holds B.A. and M.A. degrees from UCLA, was a language officer with the Navy during the war, and has done advanced study at USC and the Los Angeles Conservatory of Music. She has had wide experience as a music and literary critic and as choir director for community groups in the San Diego and Los Angeles areas.

New students who wish to register in music classes or in any of 200 other extended day classes may file applications for admission and registration permit requests at the college admission office, and arrange for their previous high school and college transcripts to be mailed to the college.

Currently enrolled and returning evening college students who have not already registered could file a request for a registration permit, which will be mailed to qualified applicants indicating the date on which they should register.

Now the contract on cans and garbage is one, but what are the rest? I think that the whole subject should be presented at some type of town meeting.

In conclusion I wish to inject one more comment. And that is what happened on the widening of Sepulveda Blvd. between Arlington Ave. and Madrona? When I ride down the outside lanes I wonder how much money will be saved by the taxpayers in respect to them. So with respect to no one, I stated the situation as I see it and let the public be the judge.
