Bishop Montgomery Adds Senior Class

"Traditional building, that is the keynote at Bishop Montgomery High School these days," the Rev. Michael J. McNulty, principal, stated.

As Montgomery moves into its fourth year, its students and faculty are looking forward to a pace-setting year with its first senior class, expanding facilities, and increased curriculum and activity schedule, he continued.

The Rev. McNulty mentioned he expects a total enrollment of 1125, with 202 seniors, 248 juniors, 305 sophomores, and a "record-setting" 370 freshman class.

A new addition to the boys' classroom building and a convent for the Sisters of St. Joseph, faculty of the girls' department, are being constructed on campus.

The new additions, costing a total of \$200,000, are expected to be completed within a few months, the Rev. McNulty said.

The fall opening of the school will see two new Conventual Franciscan Priests, who are coming to join the 12 priests, teaching in the boys' department.

The Rev. Eugene Buhr will continue as school vice principal, and the Rev. Laurence is O.F.M. Conv. will remain as dean of boys.

George Gauder, Quinn Short, James Horan, John Reveles and Norman Bruzyna will join the boys' department teaching staff.
