FRANK HOWARD COULD BE ANOTHER CLINT HARTUNG

I don't know what happened to Clint Hartung, the New York Giant outfielder who was almost as big as Frank Howard of the Dodgers and just as feared. He, Hartung, broke into major league ball a little over 10 years ago and didn't last-more than a season.

If I recall correctly, Clint hit the long ball. It was nothing for him to hit the center field wall in the Polo Grounds. Facing National League pitching, he managed to wallop quite a few homers, triples, and doubles before the twirlers got to him. He loved to hit the fast ball whether it was over his head or down at his ankles. A smart pitcher usually got him to whiff on three straight curve balls away from the hitter but usually nipping the corner. Before long every National League moundsman would pitch Hartung the same way. Before the end of his first and last season his batting average had tailed to just over .200. The Giants sent him to Jersey City, their farm club and Hartung never returned to play in the bigtime again.

Pitchers Getting to Frank

Frank Howard joined the Dodgers this year about a month after the season had begun. Almost immediately he helped the club. He hit booming home runs around the circuit and at the Coliseum. For a while he was hailed as the future Babe Ruth or Ted Williams by guys like Vince Scully and Bob Hunter. To their eyes and many more, including this reporter, Frank Howard was the savior of the Dodgers. He was going to lead them to another pen-

As you all know, Frank did no such thing. After the pitchers got to know his bad habits, any pitch but a fast ball. Howard's batting average started to tail off. He's now batting just above the .250 mark and probably before the end of September he might reach the lowly Hartung status. I'm betting that Howard will come back stronger next

year if Bavasi doesn't think he's through. An inner feeling, however, leads me to believe that Howard was just a flash in the proverbial pan and that another guy named Willie Davis will be hogging the spotlight at the Coliseum next year.
