Juniors Set Fifth Polio Clinic Today
 To aid in "the alarming increase of poliо cases" in the county the Junior Woman's Club of Wilmington, are sponsoring their 5th poliо clinic of the summer season. With September a peak poliо month, the Juniors are anticipating a large number to turn out for the shots.
 In the new stepped up vaccination plan supported by the Los Angeles Health Department spacing of the shots in the series includes a second injection two weeks after the first and a third injection four weeks after the second. A booster is recommended for all those previously vaccinated.
 The Juniors clinic will be held in the Wilmington Woman's Clubhouse, Lakme and Denni, Wilmington. The date is today from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m.
 Shots are being administered by local doctors assisted by members of the Senior and Junior Woman's Clubs of Wilmington. A donation of \$1 is asked with the proceeds going to the newly constructed Wilmington Community Hospital which serves Wilmington and surrounding areas.
 Balloons will be given to the children by "Balloon Man" Pete Aguirre. The poliо clinics are under the direction of the Junior Club Health Chairman, Mrs. William Mendenhall.
