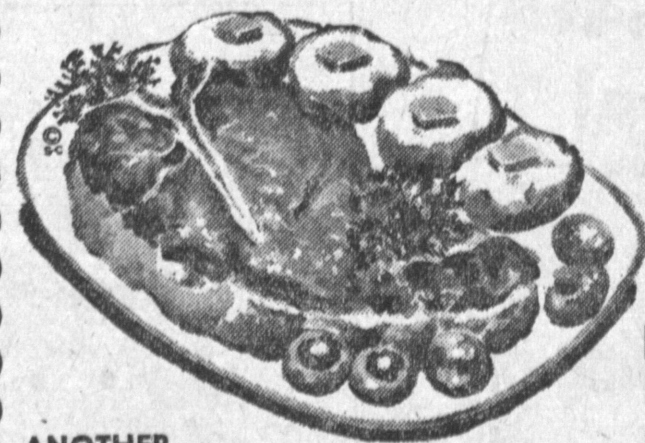

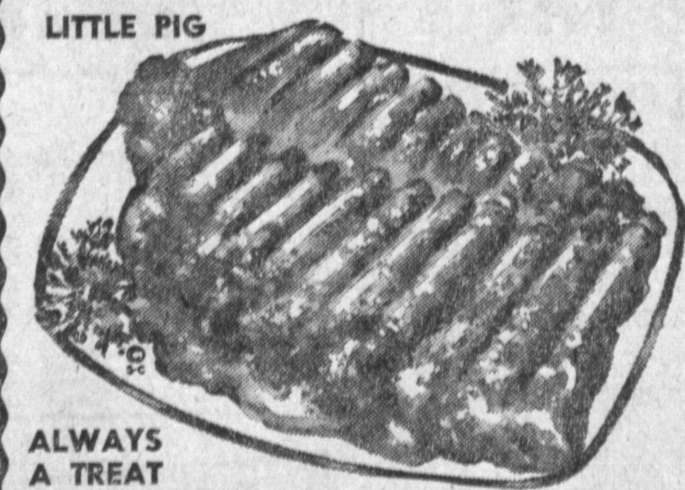

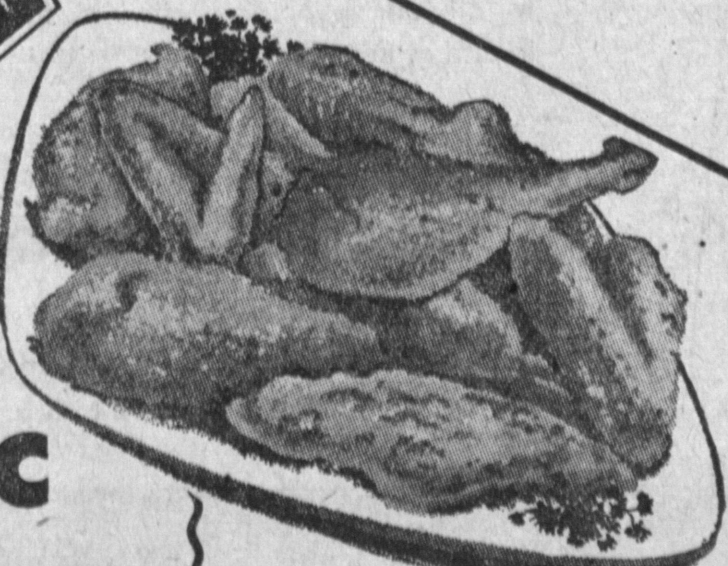

'Obey or Go Away' Is Sermon Topic

The Narbonne Avenue Southern Baptist Church of Lomita will hear another sermon in the "Foundations For Happiness" series at the 8:30 and 10:50 morning services, Sept. 25. This message by the pastor, Robert A. Wells will be on the fifth commandment.

The morning subject will be "Obey or Go Away," Mr. Wells stated. "This is another of God's laws that parents are to be honored, but be honored they must be honorable. One major factor in causing juvenile and parental delinquency is found in a failure to keep the fifth commandment of God. The cure for delinquency is to accept and obey God's law."

The guest speaker at the Sunday evening service will be the Rev. Floyd Rolf. Mr. Rolf was interim pastor of the Lomita church when Mr. Wells became pastor in 1950. Pastor Wells will be in a revival in the First Southern Baptist Church of Oxnard through the morning service on Oct. 2.

Sunday will be promotion day in the Sunday School and Training Union. The church organizations are graded on an age basis. The change to Pacific Standard time will be observed. All services will be by Standard Time.

Christian Science Lesson-Sermon

The eternal, harmonious nature of God's creation will be brought out at Christian Science services Sunday in the Lesson-Sermon entitled "Reality."

The Bible citations include these words of the Psalmist (111:2, 3, 7, 8), "The works of the Lord are great... and his righteousness endureth forever... The works of his hands are verity and judgment; all his commandments are sure. They stand fast forever and ever, and are done in truth and uprightness."

In the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," Mary Baker Eddy counsels, "Let us learn of the real and eternal, and prepare for the reign of Spirit, the kingdom of heaven—the reign and rule of universal harmony, which cannot be lost nor remain forever unseen" (p.208).

The Golden Text is from Lamentations (5:19), "Thou, O Lord, remainest for ever; thy throne from generation to generation."

That was a cup of shame and most painful death upon the cross. He prayed to God to remove it. But each time Jesus said, "Nevertheless not what I will, but what thou wilt." He was obedient to the will of God in the face of agony and sorrow.

He had once said, "I came down from Heaven, not to do mine own will, but the will of him that sent me." He spent His whole life in doing the will of God. Shall we through prayer submit ourselves to the will of God in all circumstances?

PRAYER: O God, give us the courage to run the risks of prayer—the risk of seeing ourselves as we are, the risk of becoming more like Christ, the risk of doing Thy will. In Christ's name. Amen.
