Supervisor Urges 'Pay as You Go'

Immediate development of the County's five undeveloped golf course sites through revenue bonds guaranteed by a current yearly income of one million dollars from existing golf courses was proposed last week by County Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

"There has been some criticism leveled at the County in the past by non-golfers for our proposed comprehensive site development program," Chace said. "The new course development will be paid for by the golfing public at no expense to the general taxpayer."

Several years ago, at the time that enabling legislation was sponsored by the County for small boat harbor revenue bonds, County Supervisors attempted to provide similar financing for golf courses.

However, under a ruling by County Counsel Harold W. Kennedy, the legislation was not broad enough to enable current golf courses incomes to amortize the securities.

Under Chace's proposal, County legislative representatives will bring a proposed bill before the legislature in Sacramento to permit the issuance of Golf Course Bonds.

At the same time, Chace requested the County Manager, County Counsel, the Retirement Board and the Director of Parks and Recreation as well as the Parks and Recreation Commission to bring in a joint report for alternate methods of financing new golf course development.

"Our existing seven golf courses have always been money makers, and the current income from these courses reflects a net profit after expenditures of \$231,929," Chace said.

"There is no earthly reason why these revenues should not be applied to the interest and principal of revenue bonds," the Supervisor said, concluding, "as each course is completed and opened, it too will begin returning revenues which may be applied to the bond's retirement."

New Rank Given Cadet G. Brooks

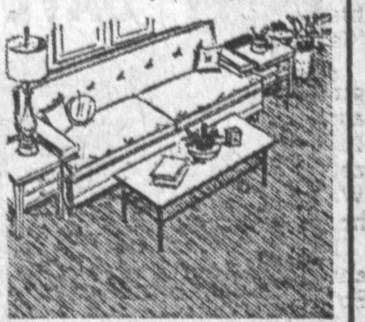

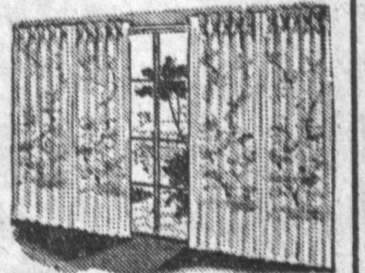
