

Sixteen Countries Send Students to El Camino

"Sixteen countries are represented by thirty-two students at El Camino College this year. Henrietta Martin, assistant director of student personnel announced today.

"These students pass rigid tests, especially in English, before they are admitted as students. They adjust easily to the American society," Miss Martin said.

"Some live in apartments, some in American homes, and some live with relatives. Foreign students want to understand us and do their utmost to do so, but we, should try to help by meeting and exchanging ideas and cultures," she declared.

Engineering majors are predominate among the foreign students with seven taking. Japan leads foreign nations in the number of students enrolled. The Japanese students and their majors are Yuji Arai, economics; Hisahiro Aoki, business administration; Hiroshi Hiroshi Kira, industrial design; Hiroshi W. Koshimoto, International relations; Susumu Maki, business administration; Kenji Mori, mechanical engineering, and Miss Tomiko Yamazaki, English.

From India are Sharanjeet Chahal, business administration, and Baldev Singh Sekhon, engineering.

Miss Setta Daghestanian, theater arts, represents the nation of Syria.

Philippines representatives are Edward Douglas Gardner, pre-medicine, and Joe Guion, industrial arts.

The five students from Iran are Manouchehr C. Firoozbaksh, electronics; Abraham Gevorgian, architecture; Ezzat Beham-Nourafshan, business administration; Parviz Beham-Nourafshan, language, and Ebrahim Yermian, engineering.

From Egypt, Miss Laurice V. Kalemkorian, a cousin of David Kalemkarian, former ECC student body president, has come to study English.

Two students represent Mexico. They are Fausto Jimenez, a student of vocational drafting, and Miss Carmen Zamora, who specializes in secretarial subjects.

Other foreign lands represented on the El Camino campus are Canada, China, Lebanon, Jordan, Korea, Honduras, Pakistan and Greece. Hong Kong is also represented by Yuen Yuk Young in engineering.

Canada's Spyridon A. Lambros majors in political science, while Ming Teh Liem of China is an engineering student.

Hassir Maalouf, Lebanon, is a student of auto mechanics, Jordan's Atalla Marcos studies mechanical engineering, and Soo Choul Yoon of Korea is another engineering major. Zaffar Ali Shah, electronics, and Marwan Sabba, engineering, hail from Jordan.

Miss Rosina Martin, a business administration major, comes from Honduras.

Three students represent the nation of Greece. They are Isidore Pagonas, economics; Nicholas Perrakis, engineering and George T. Poupelis, economics.

Most of the foreign students are affiliated with the college's International Relations Club, which is open also to the membership of native American students. Advisors of the organization are Miss Martin and Instructor Mark Jacobs of the physical science department.
