Vice President Richard M. Nixon will be in Los Angeles for a four day speaking tour Oct. 11 through Oct. 14. The Vice President and Mrs. Nixon will arrive at Lockheed Air Terminal, Tuesday evening to attend a countywide rally and welcome home celebration.

Prominent film, television and radio stars will participate in this event, with the rally beginning at 8:45 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 12, Nixon will address the All States picnic at Recreation Park, Long Beach at 3:30 p.m., and go on to Orange County where he will speak before a Tri-County gathering at Knotts Berry Farm in Buena Park.
