Simply make leg room by cutting out two sides of the box, leaving ends of the box intact to serve as "legs." Then, cover the cardboard with one of the plastic-coated coverings that are washable. The Marvalon brand has an adhesive backing that adheres firmly to any smooth surface.

Smooth off the edges of the carton. Peel off the paper backing of the adhesive covering and press the material on the carton. You won't have to overlap it because the covering won't shrink or shift once it's firmly in place.
