

BEFORE LAUNDERING
Before laundering his wash-and-wear, leisure or heavy-duty pants, check for points showing wear, and follow the stitch-in-time policy. 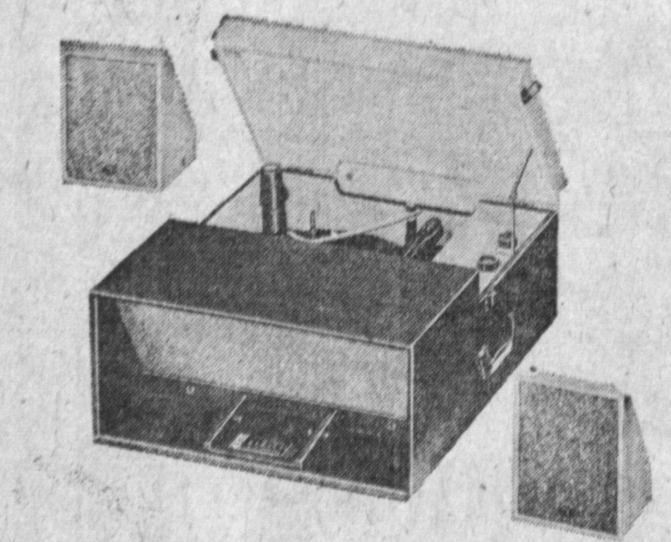
