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### Hidden Costs of Hillside Building Told by Planner

Improvement costs for hillside subdivisions may run as high as \$4,000 per lot, according to Leonard Gerkin, land planner with a civil engineering firm in Los Angeles. In flat land costs average \$2,000 to \$2,500 per lot.

In a speech before the Los Angeles Chapter of the American Society of Real Estate Appraisers recently, Gerkin pointed out the major items of cost as well as the problems encountered in developing hillside as compared to usual flat land subdivision.

Gerkin is presently serving as project engineer for the development of 7,000 acres of land in the Palos Verdes area being prepared for home construction.

Grading, a nominal cost item in flatland development, is one of the biggest costs in hillside subdivision, according to Gerkin. In flat land areas, \$275 to \$325 per lot for grading is average, but in the hills grading may run \$1,320 per lot and, if rock is encountered, up to \$1,650 per lot.

Sewers are another high cost item in hillside subdivision, the planner said. Sewers average about \$240 per lot in relatively uniform flat land, but in hillside the cost increases to about \$500 per lot.

The extra cost for street improvements in the hills runs about 10 percent above that in flat land. However, since there is more lineal feet of street per lot in hillside subdivisions, costs may run \$795 per lot as compared to \$480 in flat land development.

Cost of storm drain facilities which are often nonexistent or nominal in flat land, may exceed \$200 per lot in hillside, Gerkin added.

"The costs for water vary to a great degree with each utility company involved and are not greatly affected by whether or not a subdivision is in a hillside or in flat land, but rather by the length and size of the main in each lot."

Other costs, such as street lights, planting, plan checking (inspection and fencing) are primarily affected by the length of the street per lot rather than topography.

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
