It was still a battle when the first half ended, although the Saxons were on the short end of a 12-6 score.

The Cougars, trying to stay in contention for the Bay League leadership, took advantage of Saxon miscues in the second quarter and tallied twice before the home team could put a score in the books.

With just 39 seconds left in the second period, Jeff Bell led the Saxons to their only score of the evening. From the Cougar 25 Bell pitched to Dan Claxton for 13 and then to Roy Dohner in the flat, who raced 8 yards for the tally.

In the second half it was almost all Hawthorne as Cougar high stepping, hard-running quarterback Ron Petch led his mates to two touchdowns in the fourth quarter to widen the gap and assure the win.

North chances almost took a turn for the better in the third quarter. With Hawthorne in possession of the ball on the Saxon six yard line, Rick Jacobs intercepted a Petch pass in the end zone and ran it 50 yards before he was brought to the turf. However, an official detected illegal use of the hands and the ball was returned to Hawthorne inside the five yard line.

Hubert's passes missed the mark on numerous occasions and the Saxon line was weakened by a superior Cougar forward wall. Leonard Stone and Bill Levens contributed to the Cougar win with excellent displays of running ability.

Spartans Win First Bay League Game

With 1:57 left in the contest, South High quarterback Joe Austin fired a 21 yard aerial to Mike Andrews, who wrestled the ball from a Mira Costa defensive back to score the winning touchdown in a game played Friday night on the losers' field. A capacity crowd of near 5000 watched the Spartans gain their first Bay League victory over a stubborn, but ineffectual, Mustang eleven.

Neither team was able to score in the first period. Just before the half ended the Spartans drew first blood on a 12 yard pichout from Joe Austin to Harvey Segal. The fleet Segal romped around his own right end for the TD.

The Mustangs tallied in the third quarter when fullback Pearlman raced through his own left tackle and blasted eight yards to paydirt.

The game was marred by numerous penalties. At one point Mira Costa was penal-

ized 30 yards on one series of downs.

Both forward walls of the Bay League participants showed strength throughout the game, but South's secondary proved more effective than the Mustangs. Joe Austin, South quarterback, surprised the Mustangs with his defensive play. Many times the tall Austin, playing defensive halfback, rushed in and stopped Mira Costa running plays at the line of scrimmage.

EAGLES SCARE TARTARS

Torrance High took another step toward their first Pioneer League football championship Friday night by whipping the Eagles from El Segundo 18-13 before a homecoming crowd of 55,000.

Coach Irwin Kasten's title-bound Tartars were given a scare by the Eagles throughout the first three quarters, but THS's much vaunted offensive attack, led by the running of halfbacks Mike Tracy and Rick Bradford, exploded for two second half touchdowns.

Early in the first stanza, the Tartars fumbled on their own 20 and the Eagles, led by Gary Grosscart, who scored from 10 yards out, took the lead.

Midway in the second quarter, fleet defensive halfback Steve Parker of the Tartars intercepted an Eagle pass on a fourth down play and scampered 69 yards for THS's first tally of the evening. The Eagles led at half time 7-6.

After the homecoming festivities at halftime, Bruce Hendricks recovered a fumble on the Eagle 20 yard line. Two plays later Howard Taylor tossed a 13 yard touchdown strike to end Cliff Weimer. The latter made a leaping and sure catch in the end zone.

Kasten's title bound Tartars racked up another six pointer in the fourth quarter on their longest drive of the evening, going 55 yards in 15 plays. The drive featured the running of Bradford, two passes from Taylor to Weimer, setting up a one yard plunge for Mike Tracy.

The Eagles scored their final tally with a minute to go in the game.

Next week the Tartars travel to Culver City to meet the Centaurs in an important title clash.
