Announcement of the All-American City football team and date of presentations will be published in the Torrance press edition of Thursday, Dec. 1.





Savory Italian Spaghetti 3 slices bacon 1 can (4 ounces) sliced mushrooms drained

¹/₄ cup chopped celery 1/4 cup chopped onion 1 can (15¼ ounces) Italian style spaghetti

Cook bacon until crisp. Remove from pan and crumble. Pour off all but 1 tablespoon drippings. Add mushrooms, celery, and onion; cook until tender. Stir in spaghetti. Heat. Garnish with bacon. Makes 2 to 3 servings.
