



Construction Begins Soon on Local Space Research, Engineering Laboratories

Lieutenant General James H. Doolittle, chairman of the board of Space Technology Laboratories, Inc., and Dr. Louis G. Dunn, president this week announced that the company soon will start construction at Redondo Beach, Calif., of one of the largest space research and engineering centers in the country. When completed the ultra-modern complex will provide facilities for over 5,000 persons, including over 2,000 scientists and engineers.

TEN BUILDINGS
The first phase of the complex will consist of ten structures, including six research office buildings, an engineering office building, a library-auditorium, a service building and the corporate headquarters building. Two research-office buildings will be completed by November of next year. The engineering office building will be ready by December. An additional research-office structure, the service building, and the library-auditorium will be completed in March 1962, and the administration building in September of that year. Completion dates for the remaining structures have not

yet been set. The new center is being built to replace the STL research and development facilities in El Segundo, California, which are being acquired by the Government for its use. Site of the center is a 110-acre parcel of land on Compton Boulevard, extending eastward from Aviation Boulevard and southward to Manhattan Beach Boulevard acquired from the Sante Fe Land Improvement Company. The initial ten buildings will occupy about 70 acres of the tract. The remaining land is being reserved for future construction in line with STL expansion plans.

CONTRACT AWARDED
Master planning and architectural design of the space center is being carried out by A. C. Martin and Associates. The construction contract has been awarded to the Twaits-Wittenberg Company. STL, a subsidiary of Thompson Ramo Wooldridge, Inc., has since 1954 provided systems engineering and technical direction for the Air Force ballistic missile program which produced the Atlas, Thor, Titan and Min-
