HCLA War Drama Best of Year' in Furonean Judging

The Grand Prix and Silver Medal of the Netherlands International Student Film Festival has been awarded to "Time Out of War," a film produced by students of the Theater Arts Department at the University of California, Los Angeles.

The film depicts an interlude in the Civil War when Union and Confederate soldiers halt their fighting to be friendly for a while. It was directed by Denis Sanders for an M.A. degree at UCLA in 1955 and photographed by his brother Terry.

The award was made by His Royal Highness Prince Bernard of the Netherlands and accepted on behalf of UCLA by Philip Young, United States Ambassador to the Netherlands.

Other entries were submitted from Great Britain, France, Italy, West Germany, The Netherlands, Australia, Japan, the Soviet Union, Republic of China, East Germany, Poland and Czechoslovakia, Among American universitities, UCLA, USC, Yale, Dartmouth, Boston and the State University of Iowa were represented.

"The award recognized 'Time Out of War' as the best student-produced film made anywhere in the world during the past ten years," said Professor Arthur Ripley, head of film instruction at

"We are particularly gratified in view of the fact that many entries were heavily subsidized by the professional film academies of Iron Curtain countries, where the education of film directors is taken as a matter of national importance and much more money is spent to educate creative and competent film

"While UCLA gives the best training it can with the resources available, more teachers, production funds, scholarships and industry cooperation are needed if UCLA is to compete consistently with the best work being done elsewhere."

PUC Hearing Set Dec. 1 on Hike In Water Rate

The State Public Utilities Commission has set Dec. 1 to hear the application of the California Water Service Company for an increase in rates of approximately \$188,-560 a year in its Hermosa-Redondo district.

Examiner F. Everett Emerson will conduct the hearing at 10 a.m. in the commission courtroom at 145 South Spring Street.

The company is seeking to raise the minimum service charge for a 5/8-inch meter from \$1.50 to \$1.85 a month, with an increase of 21/2 cents per hundred cubic feet of

Under existing rates the customer using 1500 cubic feet of water a month is charged \$3.75 and under the proposed rates, if authorized, the charge would be \$4.471/2.

SERVES 21,000 The company, which serves some 21,000 customers in Hermosa Beach, Redondo Beach, a small portion of Torrance and adjacent unincorporated territory, contends it needs the additional revenue to offset steadily rising operating costs. G. L. Williams, vice president and treasurer of the company, cited-tax bills as an example. While total plant facilities increased approximately 30 per cent since 1954, Williams said, property taxes rose by about 65 per cent since then. The company claims its rate of return will decline to 4.90 per cent this year and under the proposed rates a 6.80 per cent return would be realized.

During the hearing on Dec. 1. when all interested persons will be given an opportunity to be heard, Commission staff engineers and accountants will present the results of their independent investigation of the company's operations and financial condition.
