

# El Camino Enrollments, Placement Tests Outlined by Registration Department

Placement requirements and dates for enrollment for the spring semester at El Camino College were outlined this week by Leo Christian, assistant director of registration and records.

General registration will be held January 10, 12, 17 and 19 in the campus center. Reservation cards must be secured from the registration office beginning Dec. 12. Students enrolled in 10 or more units may register during afternoon hours only.

Tests needed for registration must be completed three days prior to enrollment. Test reservations may be secured in the registration office beginning Nov. 28.

Two exceptions to provisions for general registration are priority registration and late registration. Full-time students who filed priority cards during the fall semester will be notified by mail of registration hours to be held Dec. 28 and 29 in the campus center.

**Pre-Registration, Jan. 3, 4**  
Priority registration for part-time students enrolled in the fall semester will be held Jan. 3 and 5. Priority registration cards must be secured from the registration office beginning Dec. 12.

Late registration will be held Monday, Jan. 30 from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m. and 5:30 to 7 p.m. This will mark the final day of registration for spring classes. Reservation cards are not required, but required placement tests must be completed three days before registration.

Three general requirements must be met prior to enrollment. An Associated Student membership fee of \$2.50 is to be paid at the time of registration. New students who enroll in 10 or more units must attend the orientation session in Room 8, Administration Building on Jan. 3 at 7:30 p.m.

Placement requirements for full or part-time students begin with the filing of transcripts covering high school or previous college work.

Tests include the college placement test that must be taken by new students who plan to enroll in 10 or more units or of part-time students planning to transfer to a senior college.

Specialized tests include the English placement test which is required for those who plan to enroll in business 61, English 1A, foreign language, beginning shorthand and journalism.

Algebra and trigonometry placement tests are required for those who plan to enroll in intermediate algebra, trigonometry, college algebra, commercial algebra, analytical geometry and calculus and elementary statistics.

**CHEMISTRY TESTS**  
The chemistry placement test must be completed by those who plan to enroll in Chemistry 1A. A grade of "C" in chemistry 3 at El Camino exempts the test requirement. In addition to the test prerequisites for Chemistry 1A include high school Chemistry or Chemistry 3 at El Camino and mathematics through trigonometry.

Swimming placement tests are required for those who plan to enroll in any swimming course from beginning to advanced swimming techniques.

Prospective students are reminded by Christian that all placement tests must be completed three days prior to registration and that classes begin Tuesday, January 31.

## BW Detector Contract Let to Douglas AC

A \$661,000 contract for the further research and evaluation of improved devices for the detection of biological contaminants in the air has been awarded to the Douglas Aircraft Company, Santa Monica, California, the Department of the Army announced today.

The development of advanced biological detectors is considered to be an essential element of defenses against biological attack, and is one of the areas where the Army Chemical Corps is concentrating its efforts. The studies by Douglas are expected to develop valuable knowledge contributing to the eventual development of a system for early warning of biological attack.

## DETECTION SYSTEM

It is anticipated that the system will be composed of sensitive detectors that will indicate that presence of either unusual numbers of microorganisms in the atmosphere or of varieties which are not usually present. This would give an alert

to the possibility that an attack had taken place. Identification of the organisms would be undertaken as a separate step.

When fully developed, the biological detection system is expected to be somewhat similar in general principle to aircraft early warning.
