

# Narbonne Pastor, Church Celebrate Anniversaries

Sunday will be a double anniversary for the Narbonne Avenue Baptist Church of Lomita. The Lomita congregation will mark the beginning of its seventeenth year. The pastor, Robert A. Wells, will begin his eleventh year as pastor of the local church.

The church had its beginning in a rented store building on Lomita Blvd. There were thirteen charter members in 1944. Property was purchased on Lomita Blvd. at

Walnut Avenue. This soon proved too small and the present location at 284th and Narbonne Avenue was selected as the permanent site. From this small group to a congregation of one thousand has been the story of this Southern Baptist Church.

Mr. Wells came to Lomita in 1950 to serve as pastor. The church staff has now expanded to include two other full time employees. Edwin Isabell is Minister of Music

and Education. Miss Sue Snider is educational secretary and nursery coordinator.

The Pastor will speak at the 8:30 and 10:50 morning services on the subject "Look Both Ways."

"A look at the past is in order but not for bragging purposes. A look to the future is better, for we plan to spend all of our time there. When we look at the mission record, there are six churches and one mission that this church has sponsored. Combined membership in these churches has reached 2,500. This should help us to see what can be done in the future," stated Pastor Wells.

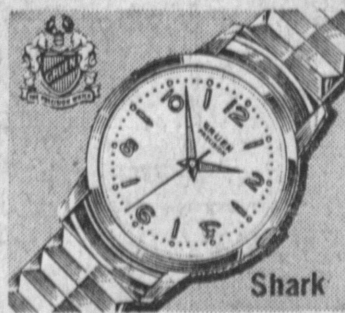
