

week and indicated a large reduction in the number of traffic injuries and fatalities and in the number of accidents.

Major cause of the reductions, reports Chief of Police Percy Bennett, is the concentrated efforts of the personnel of the Traffic Division, excellent engineering planning by the city's traffic engineers and the cooperation of the City Council.

Fatality rate in the city dropped from 11 fatalities in 1959 to seven in 1960, the report shows. A reduction of traffic accidents by 21 percent and a savings of \$300,000 to the taxpayers was also indicated.

Other accident facts shown are

Three of the seven fatalities were pedestrians. Two of them were killed during darkness and the pedestrians were wearing dark clothing at the time of the accidents. All three were killed between the hours of 5 p.m. and 8 p.m., which are the peak

hours of traffic congestion.

The door apparently has not been slammed on Torrance as the future location of the South Bay Superior Court, it was learned yesterday from county officials.

Possibility of reconsidering proposal to locate the court facility in Inglewood was voiced by the same officials although they felt that the possible inclusion of Rolling Hills Estates, and Palos Verdes Estates in the court district might not be enough to swing the location to Torrance.

John Leach Jr., assistant county administrative officer, reported that he had suggested the Inglewood location because it was closer to the geographical and population centers of the district than was Torrance. He added that the decision was made without considering the possible inclusion of the two southern communities.

Now a part of the Long Beach Superior Court District, the city councils and Chambers of Commerce of the two communities, and the Lomita Chamber of Commerce last week had requested inclusion in the new district.
