"Our basic aim at the school has always been finishing school training," she continued, "And during this training we endeavor to teach girls and women to help themselves by making the most of what they have to work with and we try to give them a keener understanding and appreciation of their potentials," she concluded.

FOUNDED SCHOOL

Mrs. Hastings founded her school in Long Beach in 1945 with her late husband Glen, and has seen the school grow from a two-man operation to a school of 350 students and 12 instructors. Recently she added a book which is sent out to all parts of the world to assit those who cannot avail themselves of her teaching personally.

Her models are almost as famed as she, and no up-todate designer or merchant would contemplate doing a fashion show without these lovely models.
