List 86 Vehicles For Every Mile Of City Streets

California now has approximately 86 motor vehicles for every mile of city streets and county roads in the State.

So said State Controller Alan Cranston as he issued a report on street and road financial transactions for 1959-60 that disclosed total expenditures of \$292,683,659.

Of this amount, \$169,516,-529, or approximately 58 per cent, was spent on 30,397 miles of city streets and the remaining \$123,167,130 on 69, 422 miles of county roads, Cranston said.

Combined expenditures in 1958-59 were \$290,188,908.

Cranston said the total number of vehicles in the State at the close of the 1959-60 fiscal year, including those exempt from registration fees wass 8,623,871, compared with 8,067,641 for the prior
