The Torrance City Council Tuesday evening deferred for two weeks an application for a zone variance submitted by R. A. Watt, which would enable the applicant to estab-lish a cut-and-cover dump between 178th and 179th St.

Protest on the application was submitted by Thiem Industries, Inc. which owns four acres adjacent, and is presently manufacturing pharmaceutical products. Dust and smoke would prove to be unsanitary in their manufacturing procedures, they reported.




