### Search for Area B-of-A Awards Winner Near End

The search to find the high school senior students who will be honored in this year's statewide Bank of America Achievements Awards program has nearly ended. Faculty committees from high schools throughout the state, including this area, will report their candidates for the various awards within a few days.

Announcement of the local winners will be made about March 20.

For "outstanding scholarship and promise of future service to society." More than 2500 Southern California students will receive certificates of achievement; 800 will get engraved trophies, and 252 who survive group oral interviews in competition with other schools will receive cash awards. In Southern California there will be 12 awards of \$1000 each, and others ranging down to a large group of \$25 awards.

Zone competitions with other schools will be held in April, and all first place winners in the zone events will go to the finals in May, where they will receive cash awards ranging from \$150 to \$1000 each.

Cash awards for Southern California alone will total \$34,500, and for the entire state, \$60,000.

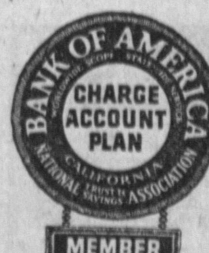
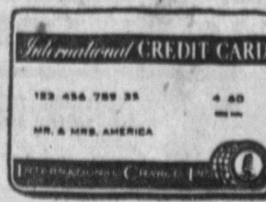
