Trade Tricks To Know, Use

Linnings and interfacings can present a problem. If one shrinks more than the other, the first washing will find vou in trouble. Best solution is to interface with the same fabric. Linings can often be bought in coordinated fabrics -that is, a solid color coordinated with the print you choose, ar a print whose main color matches your plain fabric. If both are labeled Sanforized, there is no shrinkage problem of course.

About hems and cuffs, seam tapes often pucker or shrink in washing, so the neatest method is a turned-and-stitched hem

Seam finishing doesn't present any difficulties. Raveling is at a minimum with wash- and wear cottons. Just use pinking shears to give your dress a neat interior.

Yes, all of these "tricks of the trade," help you turn out a more professional looking finished garment, and home sewing turns into an adventure. Just what did you have in mind as a starter?
