

LOS ANGELES COUNTY MUSUEM, EXPOSITION PARK


Two outstanding exhibitions: First featuring 16 major American Artists. The second; one of this country's most celebrated print makers. This will be open to the public starting May 17th.

"The Precisionist View in American Art," an exhibition of approximately 90 paintings ranging from 1915 to the present, with emphasis on the 1920's, will continue through Sunday, June 18. According to James Elliott, Assistant Chief Curator of Art, the show was organized by the Walker Art Center of Minneapolis and was assembled from leading public and private collections in the United States.

Some of the artists represented are Ralston Crawford, Charles Demuth, Preston Dikinson, Georgia O'Keeffe, Charles Sheeler and Joseph Stella.

A retrospective showing of 36 prints by Mauricio Lasansky, one of the most influential of contemporary American printmakers, has been selected by Carl Zigrasser, Curator of Prints and Drawings at the Philadelphia Museum of Art. Organized by the American Federation of Arts under a grant from the Ford Foundation, this exhibition will be shown here through June 11.
