# Mrs. Alberta Williams Chosen Honorary Mother

The ROTC Cadet Corps of Brown Military Academy recently held its annual full dress review in honor of Mother's Day. Brig. Gen. William G. Hipps, USAF, director, Readiness and Material Inspection, the Inspector General, USAF, Norton Air Force Base, was the reviewing officer. Flags of 39 states were posted around the parade ground and added much color and interest to the occasion. Following the review, Gen. and Mrs. Hipps were guests of honor at a tea and reception. Mrs. Hipps gained national fame during WW II as

an Army nurse for her services on Bataan as one of the "Angels of Bataan."

As a special part of the program Mrs. Alberta Williams of Harbor City was selected as Honorary Mother of the day and was a member of the official reviewing party. She was presented a lovely bouquet by Gen. Hipps on behalf of the Cadet Corps. Mrs. Williams is the mother of Cadet Col. Garnett Williams, Battle Group Commander of the Cadet Corps.

During the review Gen. Hipps presented awards and military decorations and promotions to several elected cadets. He addressed the Cadet Corps and a crowd estimated at over a thousand visitors who attended the ceremony. Gen. Hipps' address was a very timely message about our country's need for capable leaders and the value of military training and education in preparation for a leadership role in our society.
